- Every pledge represents our own individual participation in supporting the values and mission of AUUF. Our places in this community are grounded and flourish because the many become one in our shared place in it.

The Realities of Our Financial Needs

- Our budget supports Sunday services, programming, education, social action, second hours, memorial services, guest speakers, and more.
- The cost per person to sustain any organization is only one factor to consider, many more are discussed in the UUA's guide for ethical giving (found elsewhere on this site). It is a great resource for anyone with questions on a suggested contribution suitable for their own situation in life. Of course, any donation is gratefully accepted in helping sustain our Fellowship.
- No outside resources support our operations—*Every dollar pledged is spent on direct funding of programming, staffing, and caring for our community,* as well as the necessary costs of supporting those initiatives.
- As costs of living increase, we must provide fair and equitable wages for our *staff, half-time Minister, and half-time Director* of *Religious Exploration (DRE)*.

The Challenge of Giving

- Conversations about money can be difficult, but *money = mission = values = a just world*.
- Face-to-face interactions about giving help build understanding and connection. While that concept will always ring true, our Fellowship will always be looking for new ways to expand and broaden our outreach through whatever means are at our disposal. While we encourage face-to-face interaction among our members, we value everyone's time and ability to participate and respect your individual choices on how to participate.
- According to a study by the Lake Institute on Faith and Giving, published October 24, 2017, older donors often contribute more monetarily, yet at a lower percentage of income—younger contributors follow suit when engaged and educated on the impact of giving.
